## Women in Nichols Mentorship Program

The Women in Nichols (WIN) Mentorship Program runs throughout the academic year and pairs students with alumni in relevant career fields to help them develop their professional skills. Students get first-hand experience in the industry and career of their choice as well as receive professional advice. In our kickoff event, Susan DiClemente, a coach and consultant, led a Core Values Workshop, where mentors and mentees were able to identify five achievable core values that help guide future career decisions. During the year, student mentees also take part in virtual sessions on topics relating to professional development in the workplace with some of our previous WIN mentors.
